The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) has spearheaded the project in collaboration with various stakeholders, aiming to enhance the preservation and presentation of India's rich historical legacy.

This scheme, initiated by the Ministry of Power, involves issuing carbon credit certificates by the Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE) to entities that exceed their emission reduction targets.
- Entities failing to meet targets must buy these certificates. The Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change sets emission intensity targets, while a National Steering Committee chaired by the Power Secretary oversees the scheme. This inclusion aims to enhance carbon management in agriculture.

Located in the Western Ghats, PTR is named after the Periyar River and supports a diverse ecosystem, including tropical evergreen and moist deciduous forests.
- ✓ Its wildlife comprises elephants, tigers, wild pigs, and various primates such as the rare lion-tailed macaque. The reserve, home to tribal communities like the Mannans and Palians, also features key flora like teak and bamboos. The wind turbine aims to enhance conservation and connectivity in this critical habitat.

The estimated cost is around Rs 14,000 crores.

Half of the world's mangroves are threatened, including those in Lakshadweep and Tamil Nadu. Key drivers of mangrove loss are climate change, industrial shrimp aquaculture in Andhra Pradesh, West Bengal, Gujarat, and conversion to oil palm plantations and rice cultivation.

✓ Researchers found that the Charles Darwin's frog, native to the Andaman Islands, may be breeding in unnatural sites due to habitat loss and resource competition. This frog, part of the Dicroglossidae family, exhibits unique mating behavior, including males using complex calls and fighting rivals. The species is currently listed as Vulnerable by the IUCN.

Increased US supply is due to lower LNG prices and closer proximity to India via the Cape of Good Hope.

✓ Keeladi, located near Madurai, has revealed over 20,000 artifacts, suggesting the Sangam Era began around 600 BCE, earlier than previously thought. Additional discoveries include rice husks from 3,200 years ago and evidence of early iron technology.

The Ministry of Tourism promotes India domestically and internationally through integrated marketing and participation in travel fairs.

The GCTM, established with a total investment of \$250 million, aims to enhance global health through traditional medicine combined with modern science.
