Syngas can substitute for LPG and electricity generation, while dimethyl ether is an alternative for diesel engines, and ammonium nitrate can be used for explosives. This initiative aims to reduce reliance on imports, conserve foreign exchange, and support India's oil, gas, fertilizer, and petrochemical sectors. Currently, India imports about 83% of its oil, over 90% of its methanol, and 13-15% of its ammonia.
